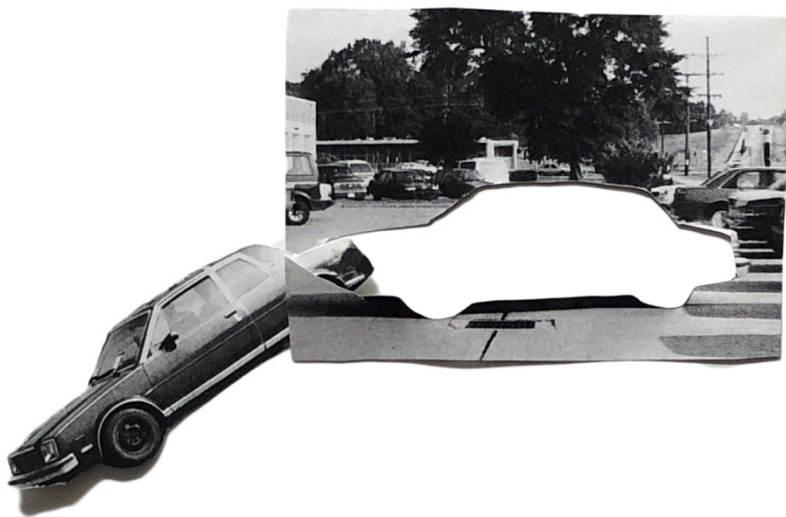

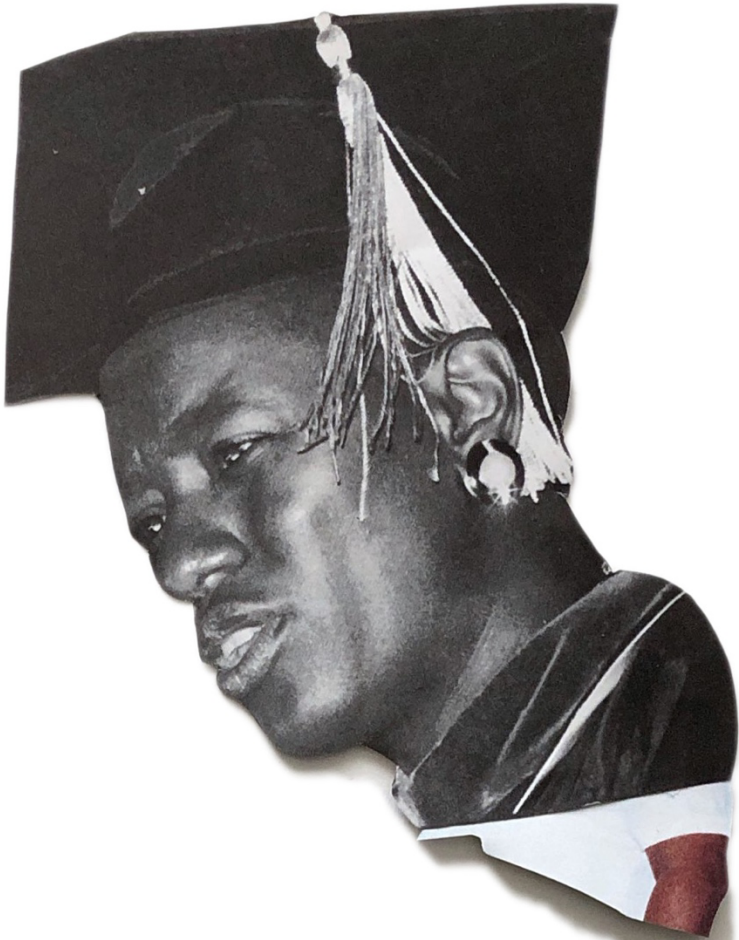

<sup>i</sup> Grambling State is a historically Black university in northern Louisiana. Their mascot is a tiger. They once bioengineered their own strain of catfish. The theme of their 1991-1992 yearbook was "Infinity." That year, students protested the senate campaign of Klan leader David Duke and the acquittal of officers who ripped Rodney King from a Hyundai. In protest, our vulnerability is enhanced. We are haunted by that enhancement.
